

Eric Clapton - The 1960s Review

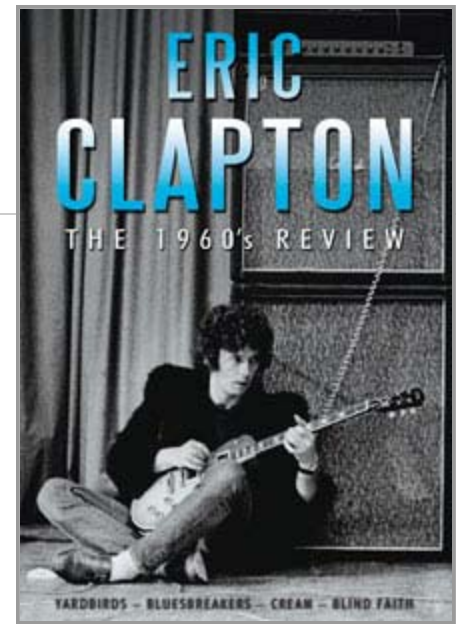
The story of Clapton's formative years.
